PROBATE.

COMMISSIONERS' COURT.

Petition of Walt Cason et al for change in County Road No. 119 was continued. Road petitions of L. L. Turner et al, Scott Brown et al, Joe Mattingly et al and W. B. Smith et al were all continued.

A duplicate County warrant, in favor of Frank Robinson, was ordered issued in lieu of a certain warrant for \$6.00 which had been lost.

Because of indefinite description the petition of F. E. Rogers et al for a County road was not accepted.

The petition of Joseph Whyte et al for change of county road was withdrawn and right of way was purchased on present site.

Petitions for bridges across the John Day river, near Early, and across Rock creek, near Wm. Hunt's farm were both disallowed.

A. L. Duthie was re-appointed Stock Inspector. John Dymart was allowed a rebate of \$51.00 on 1903 taxes account double as assessment.

Bonds of all county and precinct officers were approved. S. McGilvray, J. A. McMorris and Ira Carter were appointed to view and survey route for county roads petitioned for by George Gibbons and Ellis Schomp to meet July 18, 1904.
