PORTAGE CONFERENCE.

An important conference was held in Portland last week between the State Board of Portage Commissioners, representatives of the Open River Association and members of the Portland Board of Trade, the subject under discussion being the building of the state portage railway at Celilo. The matter was pretty thoroughly gone over and it is a matter of regret and chagrin to the people of the Inland Empire that what new light was thrown on the present status of the portage project was of such a nature as to give but little encouragement that the road will be built soon if at all.

The state portage commissioners are just now devoting all their energies to acquiring right of way for the government canal and expect to be ready to turn over the same to the U. S. government in about two months.

The Eastern Oregon men present insisted on knowing whether, after the right of way is conveyed to the government for canal purposes, a portage road can be built over it and to this Governor Chamberlain replied that "to do this it will be necessary to obtain first the consent of the government, and second the consent of those property owners who have granted a right of way for a canal only. We should have to get the consent of the O. R. & N. and we shall also need the consent of Taffa."

In other words the O. R. & N. holds the key to the portage situation more firmly than ever. If that corporation desires to have open river competition in its transportation business ten or twenty years sooner than a canal can be built it will give its consent for the portage. Who is silly enough to believe that it will do this? The portage commissioners pretend to believe it but we give them credit for more sagacity than such pretense would imply.

Is it any wonder that the people of Eastern Oregon are beginning to doubt the sincerity of the state officials in the portage matter? Is it surprising that there is a feeling here, which is growing to be more than a suspicion, that the portage is being slowly done to death by its legally appointed guardians?

J. A. Smith, of Blalock, voiced the sentiment of Eastern Oregon at the conference when he said:

"The people of Eastern Oregon are a unit in demanding the construction of the portage road and they are satisfied that the appropriation for the canal was made for the express purpose of defeating the portage railway."
