Some Big Spuds.

Just as an experiment, and to see what Gilliam county soil could do when given a clear deck and a new deal, Harry Bour, who claims to know considerably more about carpentering and cabinet making than he does about farming, a year or two ago undertook to propagate a new variety of potato from the seed. That his effort was crowned with success is shown by a sample of the new variety of spud which he left at this office the other day, the product of a single hill. The sample consisted of seven muskrat tubers, all as similar as so many peas and measuring 10 inches x 2 1/2 x 4. The aggregation all grew from one "eye" and were attached to the same stalk. Their combined weight is 14 pounds. To the Globe has been accorded the honor of naming the new tuber and after mature deliberation we have selected the name "Condon," that being a contraction of Condon, Oregon, the best town in the Inland Empire, near which the new potato had its origin. It is also the name of one of the largest birds that "flies with its own wings" and we are willing to stake our reputation as an expert on spuds that the Condon potato is not only "a hiri" among its kind but also that it will never need to borrow wings with which to soar into the front rank in the potato market.
