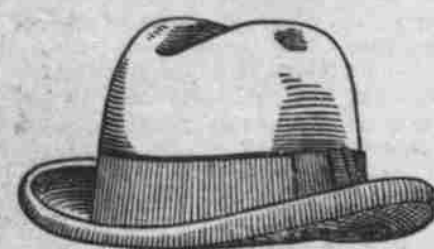

Council Proceedings.

At the regular council meeting Monday evening the ordinance prohibiting stock from running at large in the city was passed. Edward Dunn was elected as councilman to fill the vacancy caused by J. F. Reischer being chosen as mayor. Bills amounting to \$359.76 were allowed.

The mayor instructed saloon men present that gambling must remain closed and that all rooms in saloons must be left open to the marshal or policeman at all times. An order was made requiring all inmates of disorderly houses to appear at the recorder's office on the first of each month to be fined. The salary of Frank Macy, who was appointed night watchman at a previous meeting, was fixed at \$60 per month. The watchman is to go on duty at 5:00 p. m. and report to the marshal at 6:00 a. m.
