## THE LAND FRAUDS.

The land fraud investigation in the federal grand jury room at Portland is becoming interesting. Senator Mitchell and Representative Herman hurried home from Washington last week to demand a hearing before the grand jury in their own behalf in an effort to clear their names from charges of complicity in the frauds and rumors have it that Representative Williamson is also liable to be mixed up in the affair before the matter is finally cleared up. Senator Fulton just now occupies the comfortable if rather lonesome position of being the only member of the Oregon congressional delegation whose name has not been yet associated with the land frauds. State senator Franklin Pierce Mays has been indicted by the grand jury and is now enjoying his liberty because of a \$4000 bond which guarantees his appearance before the federal court. State senator George C. Brownell, of Oregon City, is also accused by Dame Rumor of having dallied with the unholy alliance of land conspirators and while he vehemently proclaims his innocence of any wilful wrong doing, those on the inside intimate that he may be indicted. All this is not only a slam on Oregon's good name and good judgment in the selection and advancement of "leading citizens" but it is no doubt disquieting, not to say embarrassing, to the gentlemen most directly interested, whether they are innocent or guilty. Judging from the tone of many southern Oregon papers which are published and circulated in Mr. Herman's district, that gentleman is a much maligned person, a veritable angel of purity, honesty and truth, who, in winking his lofty course across the foul sea of Oregon politics has been spattered by a charge of slanderous slime from the squirt gun of his political enemies and his milky white plumage sadly ruffled. This view may or may not be correct, but if we are to judge by the past antics of the voters of that district who, in the face of damaging charges against their favorite—charges which were neither admitted, denied nor made the basis for damage suits—we may almost expect to see Mr. Herman endorsed by his constituents at the next election even though he should be found guilty and the scene of his usefulness forcibly removed from Washington, D. C. to McNiel's island. This is not saying that Mr. Herman is guilty but is only intended as a tribute to the confiding natures of his constituents. This paper does not presume to sit in judgement on the gentlemen whose names have been thus connected with land frauds. If they are innocent, as probably most of them are, we hope to see them fully vindicated; but, on the other hand, if they are guilty their high position should not shield them from punishment.
