THE GUN SHOULD GO.

The city council has again closed gambling and this time they declare that no more games of chance will be allowed in the town during their term of office. It may be presumed that this order was the direct result of the unfortunate affray of last Wednesday morning in which a young man almost lost his life as the council met in special session within an hour after the trouble and made the order. While this paper is by no means disposed to criticise the city officials for this action, which is clearly in line with their duty, it would like to suggest that there is another matter that merits their attention and which was perhaps more directly responsible for the trouble Wednesday morning than anything else. We refer to the common practice of men carrying concealed weapons. Such a practice is a relic of the old days in the West when courts and juries were unknown and when the man who could "draw" quickest was the man who would probably live longest, and is altogether out of place in a modern town, in a civilized community, in this age of enlightenment. "Gun plays" have been frequent in Condon during the present winter and if the city officials really desire to bring about better conditions here they should adopt some measure to effectually put the confirmed gun man out of business. This practice is not only a menace to life and limb and a promoter of disorder but it also has a bad effect on the material interests of the town. Condon is on the eve of a boom and within the next 90 days many new people will come here looking for locations for homes and business openings and it is a sure thing that a man who has lived in a community of law and order where such practices are not permitted will think twice before deciding to locate and bring his family to live in a town where many people carry guns and occasionally get drunk and flourish them. All men who carry guns are not bad men. It is simply a "custom of the country" which should have been relegated to the back ground years ago. The public should be given to understand that the "gun habit" will no longer be tolerated and every man caught "packing" a shooting iron should be fined the limit for the first offense and sent to jail for the second. Condon is coming to the front and is attracting attention on all sides and it is time to cut out the gun play business, forget the cowboy, bunch grass days and customs and be modern.

The Milton Eagle tells of a young man and his girl, of that town, who, returning from a dance in the early morning hours, fell asleep in the buggy and the quiet old horse wandered onto the railroad track and stopped to rest. A train came along, the engineer whistled but the buggy did not move. The train was finally stopped, barely in time to prevent an accident, and when the trainmen went forward to investigate they found the couple sleeping peacefully and the lines fastened securely around the whip socket. It was no doubt a close call for the young people but who wouldn't take a chance of being struck by a railroad train for the fun that fellow should have had before he went asleep.

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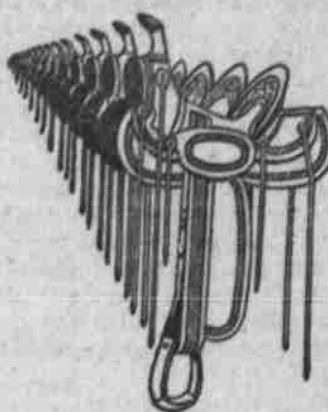
