CHOOSE GOOD MEN.

The present is a time of great importance to the future development and general welfare of Condon because the town is undoubtedly on the eve of a period of growth such as it has never before enjoyed. The country is settling up and developing and the town must follow suit. Condon is, in fact, in a period of transition, in this year of grace, from a village to a modern town and every citizen should appreciate this fact and should cast about for the best means at his command by which to assist in promoting the general welfare. The Dam of Spokanus was Moss Queen, by Manfred, 1758, Grand Dam was Fanny, 3545, by Prince of Kelvin, 656.

Great Grand Dam was Young Jean, 1831, by Young Victor, 1039.

Great Great Grand Dam Jean by Wellington, 1348.

Prince of Kelvin was sired by the Old Prince of Wales, 673, by the General and he by Sir Walter Scott.

Young Victor was sired by Old Victor, 892.

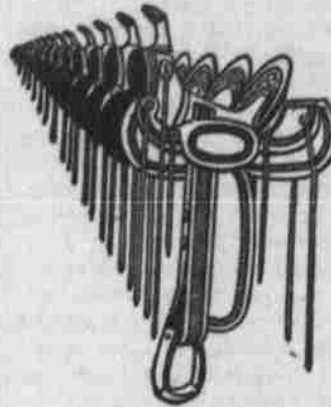
