Mrs. Sarah C. Carnine, who resided with her family on the Moyer place east of town, died last Friday morning of Bright's disease, aged 48 years and 8 months.

Deceased was born in Van Buren county, Iowa, where she grew to womanhood. She was married to J. M. Carnine in 1865 when they moved to Kansas. After several years residence in that state they came to Washington and about four years ago they came to this county. She was a member of the Methodist church. Her husband and five children, four sons and one daughter, survive her. The children are: Ellsworth Carnine, of Kansas, and U. S., R. A., A. S. and Lydia L. Carnine of this county.

The funeral took place Saturday at noon from the residence, Rev. Richard Brown conducting the services. Interment was made in Mt. Moriah cemetery.

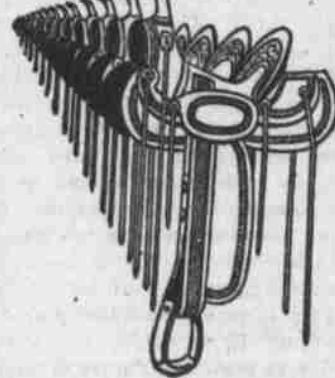
