Judge Frazer, of the state circuit court for Multnomah county, has granted a temporary injunction restraining the management of the Lewis and Clark Fair from closing the trail shows on Sunday. An exception is made in the case of the "Gay Paree" show which will not be allowed to carry on its alleged indecent graft on the Lord's day but will be restrained to six days in the week in which to flim-flam the public. It may be all right—no doubt is, since the courts have passed on it—but it does look strange that so much fuss should be made over allowing decent amusement places to be open on Sunday when the same management will allow such a sorry looking lot of old "skates" to outrage public decency and morals with their "can can" show six days and nights in every week. Wouldn't it be better to act as though we believed the Lord had something to do with every day in the week rather than try to pile all goodness up in one day and then turn the other six days over to his satanic majesty?

The city of Los Angeles, California, is said to be about to commence work on a project to pipe water from the mountains of Inyo county, a distance of 230 miles in order to procure an unlimited supply of pure water for all future needs of that city. The project will entail an expense of \$23,000,000. The pipe line will cross deserts and mountain ranges and 30 miles of tunnels will be required. The system when completed will be one of gravity, no pumping will be required. Condon should take a tip from this report from the California city and do some early figuring on a similar if very much smaller proposition. A 25 mile pipe line, over a comparatively easy country, would, it is claimed, bring an unlimited supply of pure mountain water to this town adequate to the needs of the town when it is five or more times the size it is at present. Condon needs more water just now more than it needs anything else. A gravity system is certainly worth figuring on.

W. W. Cottin, the well known attorney of Portland, has declined the appointment of United States district judge to succeed the late Judge Bellinger. Mr. Cottin holds a lucrative position as chief counsel for the O. R. & N. Co. and felt that he could not afford to accept the judicial position.

**CIRCUIT COURT ORDER.**

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Gilliam County.  
State of Oregon, plaintiff,  
vs.  
F. B. Stevens, Administrator of the Estate of George Moore, deceased, and all heirs of said deceased, if any there be, and all persons interested in said estate, defendants.  
Now at this time is presented the information in the above entitled cause of Frank Menece, District Attorney of the Seventh Judicial District of the State of Oregon, from which it appears to the court:  
That George Moore died in the State of California, on or about the 21st day of February, 1903, intestate and without heirs and left an estate in Gilliam County, Oregon; that F. B. Stevens is the duly appointed, qualified and acting administrator of the estate of said deceased and, as such administrator, has settled and closed said estate and has filed his final report in the county court in said county and state.
