### Council Meets.

A special meeting of the city council was held Monday evening with Mayor Dunn, councilmen Farnsworth, Berry, Jackson and Snover present, when the following business was transacted:

An ordinance establishing grade on Spring, Oregon and Gilliam streets was introduced, passed to third reading and adopted by unanimous vote.

Property owners along blocks one and two on Main street were ordered to put sidewalk on grade within twenty days. Dr. J. F. Wood was sworn in as councilman vice S. B. Barker, resigned.

F. A. Haskell petitioned the city council for sewer connection for the new Oregon hotel and the same was granted on condition that Mr. Haskell furnish lumber for sewer to be constructed by city from new hotel to south-east corner Main and Summit streets.

Marshal was instructed to extend present sewer to drain water from under F. M. Pitter's building on Main street.

### Will Buy Sheep.

Will Hardie, a former well-known Gilliam county boy, now of Casper, Wyoming, where he is a member of the firm of Hall & Hardie, sheepmen, is here for the purpose of buying sheep for the Wyoming ranges. He will buy at least 14,000 head in this vicinity if that many are obtainable. Hall & Hardie are now running 5000 head but they expect to increase their flock to double or triple that number next season. That section of Wyoming is progressing very rapidly, Mr. Hardie says, and is destined to become a rich section in the near future. The conditions there at the present time is about the same as they were in Gilliam county fifteen years ago, so far as the stock interests are concerned. Mr. Hardie will remain in this section for some time buying sheep. The stock will be delivered for shipment about June 1, 1906.
