

Boston Letter.

The following letter was received from the Associated Woolgrowers' Co. of Boston, Mass., by Geo. Blake of this city. It will doubtless be interesting to Gilliam county wool growers.

"The London sales opened today. Several cables from there state that prices advanced from five to ten per cent. over last sale. The bulk of the offerings were undesirable, the quantity offered was 48,000 bales less than a year ago. The market excited. There is every indication of a very active market with possibly very much higher prices the coming spring.

We understand that eastern dealers have attempted to contract in Montana, Wyoming and Oregon but have not met with much success as the growers are holding their wool above the views of the dealers. The market in Boston is very firm and the wools are well sold out. This is the condition of the market up to the present time."

Judge Ellis of Pendleton, candidate for the republican nomination for Congress from the second district was in town this week in the interests of his candidacy. The Judge has many friends in Gilliam county and made many new ones this week.
