HAD ITS EFFECT.

The exceedingly close fight between the two tickets at our recent city election is but another indication of the growing sentiment against bossism in Condon and Gilliam county. The citizens of Condon neither demand or will tolerate a political dictator. However wise they may deem his choice of candidates, however great may be their respect for the men of his choosing, they naturally revolt when they begin to realize that the black hand of bossism threatens to overbalance and outweigh their very right of suffrage. The opposition in our city election was defeated by a small margin but it indicates very plainly that the sentiment against the "one man power" is growing rapidly.

Chas. A. Johns of Baker City is seeking the nomination for Governor. Mr. Johns is a man of recognized ability and is universally well liked. He is the only Eastern Oregon candidate for this office who seems likely to land the nomination. His name should receive careful consideration by all Eastern Oregon voters.

Judge Wm. R. Ellis of Pendleton is a candidate for the republican nomination for Congress. The Judge is standing entirely upon his past record. He is not making an aggressive campaign for the office but is willing to go back to Washington, to serve and to work for the people of Oregon as he did a few years ago when he represented this district in the National halls of Congress. A careful study of his public and private life is his best endorsement. If the Second Congressional District sends Judge Wm. R. Ellis back to Congress, they will make no mistake.

The following, where a moral is clearly shown, is taken from an exchange: Recently a church congregation in a little Kansas town built a new church. To pay for it they were obliged to call on the merchants of the community for donations. The merchants responded liberally and \$300 was raised from this source. The last man asked to subscribe was John Smith, Jeweler. "I will give you \$5 if you will let me add something to the subscription list," he said. The permission was accorded him and he wrote at the foot of the list:

The church people saw the point when the minister read the list of donors to the building fund from the pulpit, and since the dedication of the church there have been no mail orders sent out from that Kansas town.

PROCLAMATION.

Whereas the secretary of state of the state of Oregon, has notified me in writing that pursuant to the provisions of an act entitled, "an act making effective the initiative and referendum provisions of section 1 of article 4 of the constitution of the state of Oregon, and regulating elections thereunder, and providing penalties for violations of provisions of this act," approved February 24, 1905, the People's Power League of Oregon, duly filed in his office on February 3, 1906, an initiative petition containing 8042 signatures properly attached to a copy of said measure certified in accordance with law, demanding that a proposed amendment to article 4 of the constitution of the state of Oregon, to be designated in the constitution as section 1A of article 4 of said constitution, shall be submitted to the legal voters of the state of Oregon for their approval or rejection at the general election to be held in said state on the 4th day of June, being the first Monday in June, 1906, designated by said People's Power League of Oregon as "Constitutional amendment for the initiative and referendum on local, special and municipal laws and parts of laws," which said proposed amendment is hereinafter particularly set forth.

Now, therefore, I, Geo. E. Chamberlain, governor of the state of Oregon, in obedience to the provisions of said act hereinbefore first mentioned, do hereby make and issue this proclamation to the people of the state of Oregon, announcing that the People's Power League of Oregon has filed said initiative petition with the requisite number of signatures thereto attached, demanding that there be submitted to the legal voters of the state of Oregon for their approval or rejection at the regular election to be held on the 4th day of June, 1906, said proposed amendment to article 4 of the constitution of the state of Oregon, to be designated in the constitution as section 1A of article 4 of said constitution, designated by said People's Power League of Oregon as "Constitutional amendment for the initiative and referendum on local, special and municipal laws and parts of laws," which said proposed amendment is as follows:

"Article 4 of the constitution of the State of Oregon shall be and hereby is amended by inserting the following section in said article 4 after section 1 and before section 2, and it shall be designated in the constitution as section 1A of article 4:

"Section 1A. The referendum may be demanded by the people against one or more items, sections or parts of any act of the legislative assembly in the same manner in which such power may be exercised against a complete act. The filing of a referendum petition against one or more items, sections or parts of an act shall not delay the remainder of that act from becoming operative. The initiative and referendum powers reserved to the people of this constitution are hereby further reserved to the legal voters of every municipality and district as to all local, special and municipal legislation of every character in or for their respective municipalities and districts. The manner of exercising said powers shall be prescribed by general laws, except that cities and towns may provide for the manner of exercising the initiative and referendum powers as to their municipal legislation. Not more than ten per cent of the legal voters may be required to order the referendum, nor more than fifteen per cent to propose any measure by the initiative in any city or town."

Done at the capital at Salem, this 28th day of February, A. D., 1906.
