In a lecture delivered at the Auditorium last night, Dr. N. F. Ravlin spoke to a well filled house on "The Terrible Calamity that has Befallen San Francisco and Other California Cities Is Not a Judgment of God." He said in part: "The reason I speak on this subject is because there is a disposition on the part of certain ministers, who claim to be God's representatives, to attribute this terrible calamity to the judgment of God on the wickedness of San Francisco. I want to file my protest against such a view of the subject. Though I may have erred in judgment in selecting this theme at this time, there arises in me an irresistible rejection of the theory that God has sent this calamity upon the cities of California because of their wickedness. I know very well that preachers, many of them, are ready to do that very thing, and have already stated to the people that this calamity is the judgment of God because San Francisco is so wicked. Now I want to place those who take such a view of the subject in a logical light. In olden times when Lot is said to have interceded with God in behalf of Sodom and Gomorrah, he was told that if he could find ten righteous men in the city of Sodom he (God) would not destroy it. Lot set about to see if he could find the ten men. He could not. Then God is said to have told him that if he could find five righteous men he would spare the city. But he could not find the five. The result was Sodom was destroyed and the city of the plains along with it. Those of you who are well acquainted with the sins attributed to Sodom know very well there is no modern city where those sins exist or are tolerated. Now, if God destroyed San Francisco because of its wickedness there were not logically in the city five righteous men. Now the truth is that San Francisco is no more wicked than other cities, and if this city had to be destroyed because of its wickedness where would Portland come in? Is Portland immaculate? Is it much purer than San Francisco? If so, then why are you so afraid of the destruction of this city? The truth is that God had nothing to do with these visitations. All these convulsions are in accordance with the operations of natural laws, whether earthquakes or cyclones, famines or pestilences. All are the works of Nature. I have too much respect for the character of God. He is not such a monster as to bring such wholesale destruction upon innocent people. There are some clergymen who think that they know everything about God's plans. The truth is that they do not know anything about it. I can scarcely

realize that San Francisco, in all its stately grandeur and magnificence, is now a smouldering waste of desolation and ruin. The pluck and heroism of its citizens will rebuild it. Its location as a mart of trade possessing one of the best harbors in the world, and its commercial necessities, will require its rebuilding. Men may predict that it is blotted out forever, but it will rise Phoenix-like from its ashes, more solid and resplendent than ever."
