GENERAL ELECTION

Bourne, and Chamberlain Carry the State. Jarvis, Dunn Rogers and Moore are Winners in the County.

At the general election last Monday a heavy vote was polled but it was a tame affair compared to the fight at the primary election. At no time in the history of Gilliam county have the voters paid so little attention to the principles that the candidates for state office represented. Many republicans voted and worked for Chamberlain and as many democrats voted for Bourne. In the county the interest seemed to center on the race for judge and sheriff. Candidates on both tickets were popular and had their friends. When the ballots were counted, it was found that Judge Dunn had won out over T. G. Woodland by 83 votes. Ray Rogers won out over George Angell by 332 votes. With the exception of John McMorris, democratic nominee for surveyor who had no opposition, the republicans elected the remainder of the ticket. Woman suffrage and prohibition were defeated in the county and equal suffrage was badly beaten in the state at large. Bourne and Chamberlain carried the county. G. L. Neale was re-elected justice of the peace for Condon precinct.
