The pre-eminent advantages of the Fall wheat are again demonstrated as practically everything but the late sown Spring grain was so far along that it was not affected by the excessively hot weather. The acreage of Spring wheat was somewhat larger than usual this year, on account of considerable reseed-ing being done where winter wheat had been killed by the cold weather. The conditions are not always favorable for wheatgrowers to get in a full acreage of Fall grain, but the experience of the past few days, as well as that of former seasons, has demonstrated beyond all question that the winter wheat is the only one that can be relied on one year with another with positive assurance of success.

Perhaps at no time in the history of Gilliam county or the state, have laboring men been so scarce as at present. There are a great many ranchers who find it an utter impossibility to get enough men to help with the harvest.
