Prof. G. T. McArthur, county superintendent of Gilliam county, in his biennial report to the state superintendent of public instruction has recommended an increase in the salaries of county superintendents. The county superintendent now enjoys the paltry salary of \$500 per year. In order to make a competent livelihood for himself and family it is absolutely necessary for him to have some other source of revenue than that which is now provided for those holding the office of county superintendent. Many of the Superintendents have secured positions as instructors in the schools and by so doing have increased their source of revenue, but to anyone who has given the question any serious thought it will be quite apparent that a competent man cannot afford to accept the office and live on the salary that is now provided. It is also apparent that a man cannot properly attend to the duties of the office if he is engaged as a teacher in the schools or in some other business. We believe that Mr. McArthur's recommendation is worthy of consideration at the hands of the state superintendent and that legislation upon the subject would materially increase the efficiency of the public schools.
