According to the bill which the lower house of Congress passed this week, Japanese colliers will hereafter be excluded from the United States. The bill had the support of Administration Congressmen and seems to be the only solution for this question.

By the creation of the new Judicial District, Senator Bowerman created what was far more advantageous to him, an opportunity of making political trades with candidates for Judge and District Attorney.

Taxpayers who pay the expenses incident to the maintenance of the new Judicial District must grin and bear their new burdens gracefully for in the Senator's opinion, its creation was absolutely necessary to save his political hide.

The bill providing for abolition of two of the four normal schools existing in Oregon, has been vetoed by Governor Chamberlain. It is hardly probable that the Legislature will be able to pass the bill over the Governor's veto and the Normal School graft will continue, as of old, an unnecessary drain on the State Treasury.

Was it because Senator Bowerman loved Governor Chamberlain and was in full accord and sympathy with his recommendations on proposed legislation, that he persistently and habitually voted with the chief executive on all important questions that were passed upon by the Senate or simply because the Senators bill for the creation of the new Judicial District, provided that the new Judge and District Attorney should be appointed by the Governor and control of such appointments would help considerably in strengthening the Senators political machine in this district.

To E. T. Hollenbeck and S. M. Hollenbeck the above named defendants: In the name of the State of Oregon: You are hereby required to appear answer or otherwise plead to the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit in the above entitled Court on or before Friday, the 23rd day of April A. D. 1907, and that if you fail to so appear and answer or otherwise plead to said complaint for want thereof the plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in his said complaint, which is substantially: First: for judgment and decree against defendants E.
