If the purpose of the daily papers is to satisfy the morbid curiosity of mankind, the lengthy accounts of the Thaw murder trial during the past few weeks have contributed greatly to their success.

It took the Oregon Legislature but a few brief weeks to make appropriations which will aggregate about \$3,570,000 and earn for themselves the unenviable reputation of being the most extravagant legislature in the history of the state.

The startling statement is made in Sunday's Oregonian that the Oregon state Senate was practically dominated by the corporatists throughout the entire session of the Legislature. Their lobbyists were omnipresent at Salem and their influence was apparent both in committee rooms and on the floor of the Senate. With the exception of the railroad commission bill, they were able to stifle every bill which threatened to injure their special interests.

Aside from local measures, but little has been accomplished by the legislature which will be of benefit to the people of the whole state. The railway commission bill is perhaps the only important measure that was able to run the gauntlet. The banking law can hardly be said to give the relief demanded by the depositors. The state will continue to support four normal schools, tax legislation failed and nearly every bill which did not meet with the approval of the corporate interests was either pigeonholed in the committee rooms or defeated on the floor of the House or Senate. With all due respect to the distinguished 1907 law givers it must be said that certain changes in the personnel of the next Legislature would not come amiss.

SUMMONS.

In the Circuit Court of the state of Oregon for Gilliam County.

To E. T. Hollenbeck and S. M. Hollenbeck the above named defendants:
In the name of the State of Oregon:

You are hereby required to appear answer or otherwise plead to the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit in the above entitled Court on or before Friday, the 5th day of April A. D. 1907, and that if you fail to so appear and answer or otherwise plead to said complaint for want thereof, the plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in his said complaint, which is substantially, First: for judgment and decree against defendants E. T. Hollenbeck and S. M. Hollenbeck, and each of them for the sum of One Thousand Dollars with interest thereon from the 14th day of November 1906, at the rate of ten per cent per annum until paid, and for the sum of One Hundred Dollars Attorney's fees, and for the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars with interest thereon from the 14th day of December 1906, at the rate of ten per cent per annum until paid, and for the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars Attorney's fees, and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements herein expended.
