To E. T. Hollenbeck and S. M. Hollenbeck the above named defendants:

In the name of the State of Oregon:

You are hereby required to appear answer or otherwise plead to the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit in the above entitled Court on or before Friday, the 5th day of April A. D. 1907, and that if you fail to so appear and answer or otherwise plead to said complaint for want thereof, the plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in his said complaint, which is substantially, First: for judgment and decree against defendants E. T. Hollenbeck and S. M. Hollenbeck, and each of them for the sum of One Thousand Dollars with interest thereon from the 14th day of November 1905, at the rate of ten per cent per annum until paid, and for the sum of One Hundred Dollars Attorney's fees, and for the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars with interest thereon from the 18th day of December 1905, at the rate of ten per cent per annum until paid, and for the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars Attorney's fees, and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements herein expended.
