ABOUT SHIPPING RATES

It has been stated that the car rates on sheep from here to Wyoming and the east were \$28 higher than from Heppner. The following letter is self explanatory and needs no comment.

Mr. D. Tierney,
Agt. Condon, Oreg.

Dear Sir:
Your favor May 24th, with reference to rates on shipments of livestock, Condon to Missouri River and other Eastern points.

Condon is on the same basis as Shaniko, that is to say, rates from Shaniko and Condon to Missouri River are identical, and this rate is \$10.00 per standard higher than Heppner, or \$11.60 per 36 ft car higher than Heppner.

Effective June 15th, these rates are applicable via Northern Pacific, as well as Great Northern, Union Pacific, etc. It is neither the intention nor desire to discriminate in any way against Condon as a shipping point, and I would be glad to have you assure your shippers that it is our desire to accord them fair treatment and a square deal in every instance.
