Horsemen, Attention.

Rough edges and sharp corners of the teeth lacerate the mouth and produce nervousness and irritability; uneven and elongated molars and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general debility. Decayed molars cause necrosis of of the bone, abscesses, nasal gleet, fistula, of the jaw, etc.
