WHO FOR U. S. SENATOR?

Under this heading, in a recent issue, we said that "Senator Fulton, although a clean, able man, is not in favor with the present administration at Washington and is not of such service to us as we have a right to expect from a senator at this time when our wants are so various." Our authority for this statement was the repeated and uncontradicted statements in the big dailies of this state and other outside newspapers, that he had quarreled with the president over Oregon appointments and had no influence at the White House at all. Now Mr. Fulton states positive in a letter to the Oregonian that "no bitter or other feud has ever existed between the president and myself; on the contrary only the most pleasant and friendly relations have existed." This statement is timely and we are pleased to be able to aid in putting it before the public. We prefer to believe Mr. Fulton's statement than any of the statements made against him and it is with great pleasure we retract our undue criticism. At Corvallis last Friday he stated his position clearly and we wish to say that in accordance with these views he is as eligible as any candidate that could be mentioned.

According to the daily papers, the big meeting given in honor of Secretary Taft's recent visit to Portland was one of the greatest successes of a political character ever pulled off in the Pacific Northwest. He spoke for over an hour to more than 5000 people many of whom were from Eastern Oregon and other sections of the state outside of Portland. He made a very good impression on his hearers and it may now be considered that his Presidential boom has been well started on the Pacific Coast. In his speech he showed how the administration of President Roosevelt stood for five distinct issues; The regulation of interstate railways and private combinations to prevent violations of the law; for the proper combination of labor that it may defend itself against moneyed combinations as far as possible within the law; for regulation of trusts and their fine and imprisonment when they disobey the law; that the Filipinos are our charges and should be allowed self government as fast as they are fitted for it; and for the completion of the Pana-

ma canal so that our commerce and navy may pass from one coast to the other without delay, danger or great expense. His speech was a lesson of great value to his hearers. Should President Roosevelt persist in his refusal to run again the Globe will be found on the Taft side of the fence.

The name of D. R. Parker is being favorably mentioned as a candidate at the coming primaries for the office of district attorney. Mr. Parker is well qualified for the office having served two years as deputy under Frank Menefee, and during said time gave the best of satisfaction; a better selection could not be made, and as Sherman county is to have the Judge, why not Gilliam the district attorney.
