

HURLBURT THE CHOICE.

Wanted for the Office of State Railroad Commissioner—Experience and Knowledge of Transportation Problems Fit Him for Office His Friends Seek to Elect Him.

It is generally agreed that one of the most important offices to be filled at the forthcoming election in this district is that of State Railway Commissioner.
