It is now thought the story that a southern farmer plowed up a million dollars of Confederate money and four thousand in gold is a fiction intended to attract city youth to the farming districts.

It begins to look like the occupation of prohibitionists is disappearing. A number of the states have voted to prohibit the sale of alcoholic liquors and the pure food laws will search out toxicants in drug stores.

The Republican State Convention will choose four delegates-at-large for the National Convention; also four candidates for presidential electors. The State Central Committee also will provide for conventions in the two Congressional Districts, each district naming two delegates, which gives Oregon, altogether, a total of eight delegates in the National Convention. Eight alternates will be named to take the place of delegates who cannot be in Chicago on June 16.

Keen observers recognize the reviving tendency of business in many ways. Railroad activity is more apparent than at any time since the panic. Factories are resuming operations; farm operations are extending and calling for more muscle, both human and equine; building enterprises quickening with the coming warm weather, yet the thousands of the unemployed - about whom there is so much talk, are still in the larger cities, where they persist in remaining idleness or at starvation wages, though there is plenty of work waiting for them in better surroundings in the country.

The Dalles U. S. land office has been the scene of unusual activity the last few days on account of trials and contents being tried on there by H. T. Jones, special agent for the government. Trials were held in this city the first of this month, followed by same proceedings in Heppner, Mo. These contents come as a result of suspensions during the past 2 to 6 years by the government of homestead entries. Final proofs where the claimants were suspected of obtaining the land for fraudulent purposes. These have accumulated through these years until now there are about a hundred that are to be decided. The Dalles office is watching with a great deal of interest by those interested in the affairs.
