Just why The Dalles persistently aspires to the title of "Cherry City" no one has been able to explain for the reason that the adjoining districts grow other fruits quite as abundantly as cherries. The Dalles peaches are the first and last to reach the market and are of exceptionally fine qualities. The Dalles cherry fair was purely of local interest and the exhibitors were all from The Dalles and sections near-by. Salem has held two cherry fairs with signal success and exhibitors from every section of the Willamette valley were in attendance. That Salem will eventually be recognized as the Oregon Cherry City is assured; indeed the Capital City has already won her laurels.
