The business men of Condon should conduct "getting-together" excursions to the neighboring towns for these visits would have a reciprocally beneficial effect. Other cities have held these excursions and received benefit from them. Why not Condon? These country trips would give local merchants and professional men a better insight into conditions in the adjacent country with which they have commercial relations. The plan if carried out determinedly would enlarge the field of operations of local business men and contribute to the development of the country and open new avenues of growth. Condon wants to see every town in this district go forward and increase in prosperity. The exchange of ideas at these meetings would prove of immense benefit to all concerned. There is danger of our local business men tying too closely to the mere town trade and of not reaching out. Since the untimely death of the local Commercial club, the excursions to near-by towns are both seasonal and of prime importance.

The Globe has at various times printed cuts of some of the Wheat City buildings. This is not done to render our home people more familiar with the various types of architecture displayed in the town but for the enlightenment of our out-of-town readers. The inhabitants of the Willamette valley, in particular, entertain a rather distorted conception of this resourceful section of Eastern Oregon. They think of it as a vast wilderness of sage brush, scattering wheat fields with a sheep and a cattle ranch, here and there. Our eastern Oregon towns, they believe to be mere rendezvous for hilarious cowboys; places where sheep herders purchase provisions. They picture our streets as filled with cowboys, riding their musangs into saloons and smashing things generally. To remove such nonsensical, erroneous conceptions, and "wild and woolly" ideas, the Globe prints cuts of Condon and the surrounding country.

All eyes are turned to Mayville where the second annual fair under the auspices of the grantee of Gilliam and Wheeler counties is to be held October 8 and 9. Many Condonites are planning to attend but to insure a large attendance from this city, it will be necessary for the fair committee to make adequate arrangements for conveying the crowds to and from the fair grounds. Then there must be eating accommodations for the visitors.

The Hood River Applegrowers Association have just closed a contract for 80,000 boxes of the growing crop and now have under discussion the sale of 150,000 boxes.

Exhibitors, Attention!
