water rate of \$25 which he said was too low and had been overlooked when other rates were raised a few months ago. No definite action was taken at this meeting.

To defray the heavy expenses of the city, to pay the \$3,060.00 interest now due on the bonded water system, and to help defray the big item of new water mains, the council voted a ten-mill tax. Since the meeting, it is said that several councilmen are trying to raise the ten-mill levy as more money must be raised.
