Maley of Condon. In 1886 they moved to Gilliam County where Mr. Maley died in 1888. A brother and two sisters survive her: R. L. Smith of Corvallis, Mrs. Wm. Clift of Oakland California, and Mrs. Agnes Collins of Condon. The funeral was held in Ferry Canyon Wednesday Rev. E. Curran conducting the services.

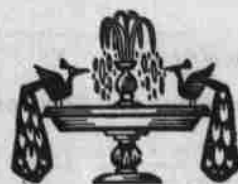
