J. N. Baylis returned Wednesday from Portland.

January is to spell death to the coyotes in the state of Oregon, according to the plans which have been announced by Secretary Dan P. Smythe, of the State Sheep commission and the State Woolgrowers Association. During the coming month the flockmasters of the state are to wage a systematic and concerted warfare upon the greatest enemy the wool grower has to contend with. Dogs, guns, traps and poison are all to be brought into requisition, and it is expected that the number of coyotes can be greatly reduced during the 31 days in the month that has been designated for slaughter. The same plan was worked last January, and, according to the reports that were received from all parts of the state, hundreds of the animals were slain. It was the success of the first effort which led the officers of the state association to repeat the experiment. —Heppner Gazette.

RAPID GROWTH OF DRY FARMING METHOD

The growth of the Trans-Missouri Dry Farming congress in three years, from a somewhat local movement among Colorado "Dry Farmers" to a great international congress in which representatives of millions of acres of lands in the arid districts of the world are working together to study the problems confronting the "arid land" farmer, is one of the interesting developments of the year. Hon. Elihu Root, secretary of state, has just issued letters from the state department inviting the ambassadors and ministers of all nations represented in Washington to participate in the coming Third Congress of the Dry Farmers, and all nations having districts where the rainfall is slight and where irrigation is impossible, will be urged to send delegates to attend the congress and to study there the methods advocated by the western farmers, who have been mastering the problem and who have already "made good."

The Third Congress will open in Cheyenne, Wyo., February 23d next and will continue three days.

Already Algeria, Turkey, Turkistan, Russia, Australia, New Zealand and Mexico have joined the congress the memberships being in the names of the Agricultural Secretaries and these countries will probably make an effort to place reports before the congress and to discuss their needs and conditions. Australia recently sent Commissioner Strawbridge and Senator James McCall as agents for the government to study western conditions and the so-called "Dry Farming" methods in practice. They have just issued a 100-page report showing the conditions reached after comparing American conditions with those in Australia.
