A Dramatic Incident of the Fateful Hundred Days.

ONE OF NAPOLEON'S COUPS.

The Way of the Great Military Genius Overcame the First Opposition He Encountered on the March to Paris After His Return From Elba.

A siriking incident in the cureer of Napoleon is described by Camille Coeuand in his book, "Le Retour de l'Isle d'Elbe" ("The Return From the Island of Elha"s. It describes how he met the first opposition offered to his march to Paris after his escape from Elba;

"Meanwhile Napoleon had traveled by the Alps to Douphine, advancing into the interior of the country, Having received information on Sunday, the 4th of March, the prefect of PIsere had immediately, in concert with the military authority, taken measures to deal with the stariling situnifou. A detachment composed of $\mathfrak n$ hattallon of the Fifth regiment of the line and two computites of engineers was disputched to prevent the further advance of the emperor. "The meeting between this detach

ment and the little troop from the Isla of Eilin took place on the 7th of March near Vizilie, but not before the pensants had bud time to busten to inform Napoleon of the annaronistic disposition of the officers commanding the troops which had been sent from Jan, 19, he will be sorry. 
