A stock company is being organized at Montague for the purpose of drilling for artesian watr. The stockholders of the company are the farmers of the Montague and Eightmile neighborhoods. A drilling machine, with which it is possible to go own 1800 feet has been secured and it is prodable that T. Womelo handle the machine. Thefe are several artesian wells at Castle Rock, almost directly across the river from the Montague country, also one on Butter Creek, and the residents of Montague an at less than the depth of 1000 eet. Operations will start on the Asher Montague place and several other wells will be sunk. The primary object of securing artesian water is for irrigation purposes. Although the soil in that section of the county is of the best, the late dry years have ally thaged the formers, especsettlers, but it is hoped that with the advent of artesian water the land may be made highly productve regardless of dry seasons.
