The French official report says that the French left has been drawn back to the eastern border of Soissons where the battle is waging furiously. On the right flank the Franco British forces after energetically defending Mossy and St. Thierry, four miles northwest of Rheims, have drawn slowly back south and southwest to the heights they are holding between the Canal and the Aisne. In the center the fighting continues fiercely at Vesles on the south bank where the French are valiantly defending the heights.
