SERVICE RESERVE IS ENROLLING RAPIDLY

Washington, June 1.—England has been in the war almost three years longer than the United States, but this country already is stepping ahead in enrolling and placing men in skilled war jobs.

Four months after its organization England's National Service Volunteers reported it had enrolled 320,000 men and placed 13,000 in service at a cost of \$577,000.

Three months after organization the United States Public Service Reserve had enrolled 315,000 men and placed 13,000 at a cost of \$22,238 to the government.

VOLUNTEERS CALLED

Portland, Or., June 1.—Men rejected from the army because of minor physical defects are given the opportunity to volunteer for important special or limited service through a call just issued by the War Department. This special service is in spruce production work and includes a wide range from telegraphy and cooking to automobile and locomotive driving. Those who desire to volunteer must do so, however, by June 6 for after that date if the required number of men have not been obtained voluntarily they will be taken from the draft registration lists.

All German alien women in Gilliam county who are over 14 years of age will be required to register on Monday, June 17, before Postmaster McMorris in Condon. Each registrant is required to furnish four unmounted photographs of herself not larger than 3x3 inches in size and the pictures shall be of the shoulders and full face, without hat or other headcovering.
