Dune grading moratorium 'didn't make sense'

At Tuesday night's meeting, the council adopted the advice of the city's land use attorney Bill Kabeiseman, who said in a staff report he believed that a moratorium could interfere with some sand management permits are approved without controversy

"There are some types of grading that are prudent administratively," said Barnes. "It's a different nature. There are small projects, people's porches, that go on regularly. If you're going to adopt a blanket moratorium that covers those projects too — you want a lot of specificity on what is covered in the moratorium."

In addition, the town currently has no due applications for the fall and "nothing is coming up in spring," according to Barnes.

"There's nothing in the queue fall 2015 until 2016?" asked Council President Melissa Cadwallader.

"It's possible somebody could push hard to do this," said Barnes. "There are only a couple of parties doing this. But I haven't really talked to anybody about a

fall 2015 campaign at this point."

All requests for grading must be addressed within 120 days, Barnes said. Any application that would have come in before adoption of the moratorium would not have been subject to its terms.

Council members said that the current sand management plan was working and could continue to do so while the city updated the plan.

Barnes said that if a budget was adopted for a dune grading plan, he would like to put a consultant under contract late in the winter and have a plan delivered in February and March.

"I don't like the idea of a moratorium," said Mayor Sam Steidel.

Councilor Wendy Higgins said since the Comprehensive Plan was being revised and would be delivered early next year, it didn't make sense to adopt the moratorium for "something that's only going to save us a few months. I'm looking at it from a financial perspective. Time is money."

"You still have the same tools," said City Manager Brant Kucera. "It seems to me it's pretty sound."
