- **Drivers may use their own vehicles and receive .575 per mile reimbursement or use the agency vehicle.** All drivers must pass a criminal background check and have a valid driver's license prior to starting work. Lunches are delivered on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and take about 2-3 hours.
