Coast Guard aircrew rescues pair of hikers trapped by tide near Hug Point

A Coast Guard Air Station Astoria aircrew hoisted two hikers to safety early Monday morning near Hug Point after the hikers became stranded on an outcropping of rock when the tide rolled in and cut them off from the beach.

The hikers, both 20-year-old females from Canby, were brought to local emergency responders on scene without visible injuries, Petty Officer 1st Class Levi Read said.

Watchstanders at the Coast Guard Sector Columbia River Command Center received the request for assistance from the Clatsop County Sheriff’s Office at 11:45 p.m. Sun-

day after the mother of one of the hikers reported them missing.

“The girls had wandered pretty far down the coast from where they were originally supposed to be,” Petty Officer 3rd Class Jonathan Klingenberg, of Coast Guard Public Affairs, said.

The hikers had become disoriented and trapped by the incoming tide. An MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew rescued them at 2:45 a.m., about 2.5 miles south of Hug Point. It is

unknown why the hikers became disoriented, but “we believe that they just lost their way,” Klingenberg added.

“We get a lot of these (incidents),” Clatsop County Sheriff Tom Bergin said.

The weather at the time was reported as clear skies and calm winds.
