His time-honored traditional folk songs and ballads will have folks of all ages singing along, and Miller will interweave stories that will evoke a by-gone time when entertainment was homemade.

An Oregonian, Miller has performed at the Walnut Valley Bluegrass Festival, the Tumbleweed Music Festival, and the Kentucky Music Weekend.
