Former Seaside resident Walker Lundberg will be remembered at the Tides at a Memorial Day flag-raising in his honor. The ceremony will take place at 3 p.m.

When purchasing a unit at the Tides, Lundberg became enthralled with the idea of putting up a flagpole, his daughter

Jani Gurash wrote in a remembrance. "He wanted it to be able to be a heartfelt symbol seen from the turnaround, flying proud for all to enjoy while walking south the end of the Prom."

During the summers, Lundberg could be seen taking down the flag in the evening. He would include the children staying at The Tides in the ceremony, saluting, honoring and folding "old faithful."

Lundberg was born in Seaside Jan. 8, 1925. He was ac-

tive in high school on the track team, swim team and basketball team. He attended Oregon State University and graduated from the University of California in Berkeley.

Lundberg was a Navy pilot, playing on the Navy basketball team, flying in the South Pacific as well as the Naval Reserves. He started his own insurance agency in Sanger, California, where he and his wife, Shirley, raised their three daughters, Emily Lundberg, Janis (Jani) Gurash

and Susan (Susie) Corden. He was a successful businessman, from a one-person office in Sanger to a large office in Fresno with satellite offices in the surrounding area. He was involved in the Independent Insurance Association, serving as president of the California Association as well as on national boards. He died in 2012.

Lundberg's daughter Jani Gurash remembers summers in Seaside and her father's desire to build a flagpole that could be seen all the way downtown.
