- Public Works Director Dan Grassick presented the contract advertisement for the Fir Street Bridge Rehabilitation.

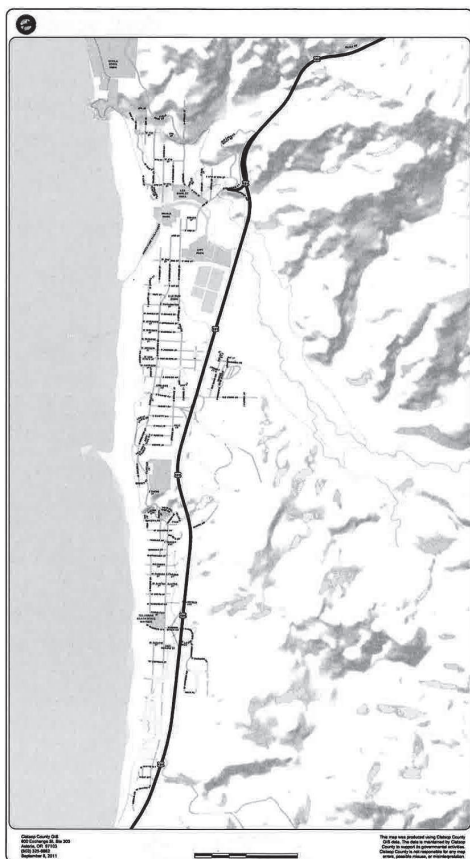
### CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION, September 13, 2016
