

# Concert series honors memory of Tom Drumheller

On Saturday, Sept. 29, the second Annual Cannon Beach Steinway Piano Concert Series opens at 7 p.m. This Steinway piano concert series is hosted by Cannon Beach Community Church, in downtown Cannon Beach.

The opening concert features Stephen Beus, Steinway classical pianist, playing the 7-foot Steinway grand piano at the church.

Beus plays this concert as a memorial benefit, with \$10 donation at the door to benefit our local Cannon Beach Food Pantry, in memory of Tom Drumheller, who died in September 2017. The concert is open to the public.

Beus, an internationally

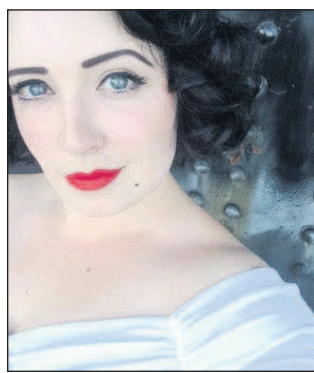
acclaimed Steinway piano artist and a long-time friend of Drumheller, teaches piano performance at Brigham Young University, with recitals and performances across the United States as well as in Kazakhstan, Russia, Finland, Denmark, United Kingdom, Switzerland, Germany, Georgia, China, France, Italy, Portugal, the Czech Republic and Morocco.

On Saturday, Oct. 13, at 7 p.m., the Steinway Piano Concert Series at Community Church will feature Teresa Renee, a Portland-based singer, pianist performing jazz, film score music, piano solos, and more.

Renee, a graduate of Portland State, will be playing a benefit concert, with all pro-

ceeds to the Cannon Beach Food Pantry. This concert is open to the public. Admission is \$10 at the door.

On Saturday, Nov. 3, at 7 p.m., the Steinway Piano Concert Series at Cannon Beach Community Church features solo jazz pianist David Robinson perform-

ing music by Italian pianist/composer Ludovico Einaudi, with a nature photo show featuring 2018 photos of the Tour of Mont Blanc by local nature photographer Thomas Robinson projected on the big screen.

The show "White Clouds over Mont Blanc," is part

of the Stormy Weather Arts Festival and will benefit the Cannon Beach Food Pantry. The concert is open to the public, with a donation of \$10 accepted at the door.

Also in November, on Sunday, Nov. 18, at 2 p.m., at Cannon Beach Community Church, the North West Piano Trio and Friends will perform a program, "Three, Four, Five," with selections from Dohnanyi's Serenade for String Trio in C Major, Mozart's Piano Quartet in G Minor, and Dvorak's Piano Quintet in A Major.

The North West Piano Trio and Friends features Heather Mastel-Lipson, violin; Heather Hillebrand, cello; Susan McDaniel, Piano; Nelly Kovalev, violin; and Hillary Oseas, viola.

The Northwest Piano Trio, founded in fall 2014, is based in Portland.

Members of the trio are passionate about collaboration with artists of other disciplines to provide unique performances that give listeners a contemporary perspective on a non-contemporary art form. The concert is free and open to the public.

On Saturday, Dec. 22, at 3 p.m., the concert series features Astoria pianist Jennifer Goodenberger, playing Mozart and holiday favorites, along with Christmas songs and carols. The concert is free and open to the public.

All concerts in the second annual Steinway series are performed at the Cannon Beach Community Church, 132 E. Washington.

## Providence Seaside program improves transportation options

Providence Seaside Hospital recently partnered with Rinehart Clinic, in Wheeler, to expand its Community Connections transportation program into Tillamook County.

The free community benefit ride program is a ministry of Providence Seaside Hospital that allows patients with medical appointments in Clatsop County and/or the Portland metro area to reserve transportation through the hospital.

In 2017, Community Connections provided 1,625 rides totaling 55,784 miles. The program is staffed with a program coordinator, part-time driver and several volunteer drivers.

Rinehart Clinic is a federally qualified health center located in north Tillamook County that provides health care regardless of health con-

ditions or financial circumstances. As a federal qualified health center, Rinehart Clinic has programs available to help patients who may have difficulty paying their health care bills.

The Community Connections transportation program serves people of all ages who

have limited transportation options and meet certain income eligibility criteria. Clients are asked to schedule ride requests 14 days in advance of a medical appointment. To learn more, call Providence Seaside Hospital Community Connections at 503-717-7766.

## Tourism summit comes to North Coast

Those interested in shaping the tourism industry for the North Coast are invited to share their opinions at the North Coast Tourism Summit Sept. 25 in Garibaldi.

The summit is a part of a multi-year rural tourism studio, a project where professionals from Travel Oregon lead workshops and offer

guidance on how to make tourism sustainable — environmentally and economically — for Clatsop and Tillamook counties. At the end of the process, the grant must be used to finance a tangible change or product, like connecting a trail system or launching an environmental education program.

Residents and industry professionals are invited to

discuss tourism-related issues such as encouraging stewardship best practices, integrating more cultural heritage into the visitor experience, and finding ways to reduce congestion during peak seasons.

The workshop will be held 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Old Mill Event Center in Garibaldi. The event is free, but participants must register at industry.traveloregon.com.
