Tom Grant in concert

Tom Grant and vocalist Shelly Rudolph appear at the Astoria Golf and Country Club on Saturday, Feb. 2. Their set highlights an evening of music and fine dining, with an evening opening performance by North Coast jazz standouts R.J. Marx and John Orr.

Grant, master instrumentalist, talented singer and natural entertainer nimbly walks the line between jazz tradition and modern pop. This soft-spoken Oregon native's inspired songwriting produces propulsive R&B grooves, infectious melodic hooks, and stylish ballads with equal ease. He plays jazz piano with harmonic sophistication and a deep sense of swing.

Rudolph has been singing, performing and composing for over 20 years. She is currently among the busiest vocalists in Portland, performing regularly every week with her own projects as well as with Grant.
