INTERESTING BITS OF CONDENSED NEWS GATHERED FROM
VARIOUS SOURCES IN OREGON

By defeating Dayton Sunday Sheridan claims the baseball championship of the upper Willamette valley.

The Oregon Loganberry association has raised \$1200 to be used in a campaign by the Salem commercial club to advertise loganberries and obtain a better market for them. The work will be commenced immediately.

The 600-acre fire that has been burning for some time six miles southwest of Canyonville has been quenched, and the men returned only to start out again to fight a new fire on Panther Gulch, six miles southeast of Canyonville.

In addition to the list of state and privately owned lands now opened for settlement on and near the Tumalo project, the Oregon State Immigration Commission is now collecting data from all parts of the state and in a short time will issue a similar list covering available lands in practically every county in Oregon.

Complaining that the management of several railroad companies in the state allowed passengers during the recent warm spell to remove their shoes, and that the atmosphere of the cars became unbearable, a resident of the state, whose name is withheld, has asked the State Railroad Commission to issue an order forbidding passengers from indulging in the practice in the future. Pending an investigation to determine whether it has jurisdiction over the subject matter, the commission has taken the complaint under advisement.

O. A. Miller, son of J. H. Miller, proprietor of the Junction City water system had his right hand

cut off Saturday while repairing the pump at the pumping station. The plant is operated by electric power and the young man was cleaning the gearing, when in some manner he turned the switch, starting the machinery and it drew his hand into the gearing in such a manner as to cut off the hand at the wrist.

H. D. Badger and wife, while on their way to Ashland the other day had the good fortune to sight a doe, two yearlings and a fawn near the summit of Greenspring Mountain. The animals were quite tame and waited by the road until the car went by and stopped, when they walked across and went into the brush, seemingly very little frightened. A short time ago a five-prong buck was found dead in Jenny Creek, having been shot by some hunter and not found.

The movement of the recall of the Columbia county court is being urged in Clatskanie. The petitions which are being circulated cite the following alleged facts and charge selfishness and extravagance in the management of the business of the county on the part of County Judge W. A. Harris and Commissioners Louis Fluhrer and John Farr: That a road has been ordered built between the city of St. Helens and Columbia City and Warren highway at a cost of about \$30,000, which road when completed, will be of no practical benefit to the public and is being built parallel with the present county road for a distance of about three miles, also that an automobile truck was purchased at a cost of \$4,675 without advertising for bids.
