Eugene's improvements for 1914 was \$750,000.

Irving farmers are boosting the beet sugar industry.

Baker county's mining output for 1914 was \$1,500,000.

W. B. Gafke has established a wholesale house at Albany.

Seventy men with families have been set to work digging sewer ditches in North Salem.

The Southern Pacific shops have re-opened at three places, giving employment to 1200 men.

The North Bend Manufacturing Co. is getting out \$15,000 worth of mystle wood novelties for the Panama fair.

One of the plausible things to come before the legislature is a state institution for the care of crippled children.

Grants Pass is pushing for three new industries in 1915—a beet sugar factory, a custom mill to crush ore, and a plant to prepare lime rock for fertilizer.

A Pentleton manufacturer of toilet preparations makes a house to house canvass to introduce her line, and gives a free treatment at an up-to-date beauty parlor to each purchaser.

Upon pleading guilty Monday to a charge of forging the name of G. E. Stanfield at Echo, C. D. Long was sentenced by Judge G. W. Phelps, at Pendleton, to a term of from two to 20 years in the penitentiary.

Captain V. S. Wheeler, aged 81 years, one of the oldest pioneers of southwestern Oregon, died at his home in Marshfield a few days ago. For 51 years he had been a member of the Oddfellow's lodge.

The first official act of Circuit Judge George Nolan, who succeeded Judge Benson on the Klamath-Lake bench this week, was to give a chance to make good to A. L. Pumford, a young man charged with forgery. Pumford has been in jail since June, and believing that this was a sufficient lesson, Judge Nolan, after Pumford pleaded guilty, suspended sentence for a year, provided that Pumford reports to the court once a month, and does not leave Klamath or Lake counties.

A large meeting of interested property owners was held at Woodburn Wednesday relative to the proposed expenditure of \$8000 on one and one-quarter miles of hard-surface highway on the north fork of the Lewis river. The road will be built, property owners paying 15 per cent of the cost.
