INTERESTING BITS OF CONDENSED NEWS GATHERED FROM
VARIOUS SOURCES IN OREGON

Klamath Falls is out for a beet sugar factory. Meetings are being held throughout the county to get acreage signed up.

The fruitgrowers of the Free-water valley have organized a fruitgrowers' union, to take the place of the Milton fruitgrowers' union, lately dissolved.

Commencing March 1, seven tons of acclimated seed corn will be distributed among farmers in the territory served by the O. W. R. & N. railroad by C. L. Smith, the company's farmer. It is the intention to see that each farmer receives enough seed to plant at least two acres.

It is stated that in the Willamette valley many farmers are plowing up clover fields, and even clearing up brush lands, for the purpose of increasing their wheat acreage, indicating that the coming season will see the biggest grain crop ever turned out in western Oregon.

A. B. Wilkins, who has been trapping in the mountains above Wendling on the ridge between Camp Creek and the Mohawk river, caught a large black timber wolf in one of his traps lately. Many cattle have been killed on that range during the past two years, even large beef cattle, and it is supposed there is quite a large band of these wolves.

Mrs. Dixie Egenhoff started divorce proceedings in Marshfield a few days ago after she had missed her husband for several days. Hearing he was at Inlet, she went there in a boat only to find him claimed as the spouse of another. The first wife was invited inside to join the festivities, but refused and swore out a warrant for the arrest of her husband, charging him with cruelty, drunkenness and bigamy.

In an automobile race from Pendleton to Lehman Springs, last week Henry Rosenberg lost a prize of \$1000, and his big Franklin car, which caught fire on Yellow Jack Hill, and completely destroyed. Rosenber and Elmer Moore, owner of a Buick, made a wager of \$1000 on the race, Rosenberg wagering that he could reach Lehman Springs half an hour ahead of Moore. The latter was 20 feet behind Rosenberg when the fire started.

An auto trip from Solem to Independence by four employes of the state hospital for the insane ended Saturday night in the death of one of the party, Walter Hackety, aged about 35 years, and unmarried. While in Independence the party sampled the drinkables other than water, and on the way home Hackety was seen to be somewhat sleepy and his companions supposed he was affected by the liquor consumed, though the quantity was not large. Arriving home Hackety not answering a request to get out, his companions started to lift him out of the auto, and then discovered that he was dead. The coroner examined into the matter and discovered that a weak heart, unable to stand the stimulant, resulted in death.
