INTERESTING BITS OF CONDENSED NEWS GATHERED FROM
VARIOUS SOURCES IN OREGON

Frank Davey, of Salem, speaker of the 1907 session of the legislature, and member of the recent session, will succeed Tom Wilson as clerk of the penitentiary.

The jetty at Nehalem is completed for about 1,200 feet and is already having a marked effect upon the channel. Rock is now being dumped into about 20 feet of water.

Chamberlain is advised by the postoffice department that as a result of the inspector's report the Tillamook postoffice will be removed to the Masonic building, for a term of five years.

Governor Withycomb has issued a requisition upon the governor of New York, asking for the return to this state of A. B. Cook, wanted in Salem for issuing fraudulent checks. He is under arrest in Brooklyn.

The co-operative cannery at Newberg paid to farmers of that region \$24,454 last year, practically all of it for produce which would otherwise have been lost. The cannery made a net profit of about \$3,000, which was better than expected for the first year. Co-operative establishments of this kind are likely to prove the salvation of thousands of Oregon farmers.

While returning from a call at Olney last week Dr. Pilkington of Astoria had a narrow escape from serious injury when his automobile skidded in the soft clay and dashed down a gulley at the side of the road. Luckily the machine struck right side up, permitting the driver to escape with but a slight jar. The physician had to get a team to pull the car back into the road. The car fell 15 feet.

Discovering three burglars robbing the general merchandise store of Joe Gooding early Saturday morning at St. Paul, Dan Girdle, a citizen of that town opened fire with a rifle, and killed one of them. Deputy Sheriff Needham shortly afterward arrested James Grady and Frank Undermeyer, and they are being held in connection with the burglary. The former had plunder on him, and although none was found on the latter, he is held as a suspect. Girdle's attention was attracted to the store about 6 o'clock in the morning by the crashing of glass and he saw three men enter. Arming himself with

a rifle, he waited for them to come out. When they finally emerged loaded down with plunder he called on them to halt, and when they broke and ran, he fired, with the result that one was killed. He has not been identified. Grady was recently released from the county jail where he had been held for several months on a vagrancy charge. The plunder found on Grady makes a clear case out against him, declares the sheriff. It is believed the men are the same who four hours earlier burglarized three Wilsonville stores without getting any loot of value.
