Mr. and Mrs. Carpenter, of Beaverton, arrived in Sandlake Sunday. They are looking at the country.

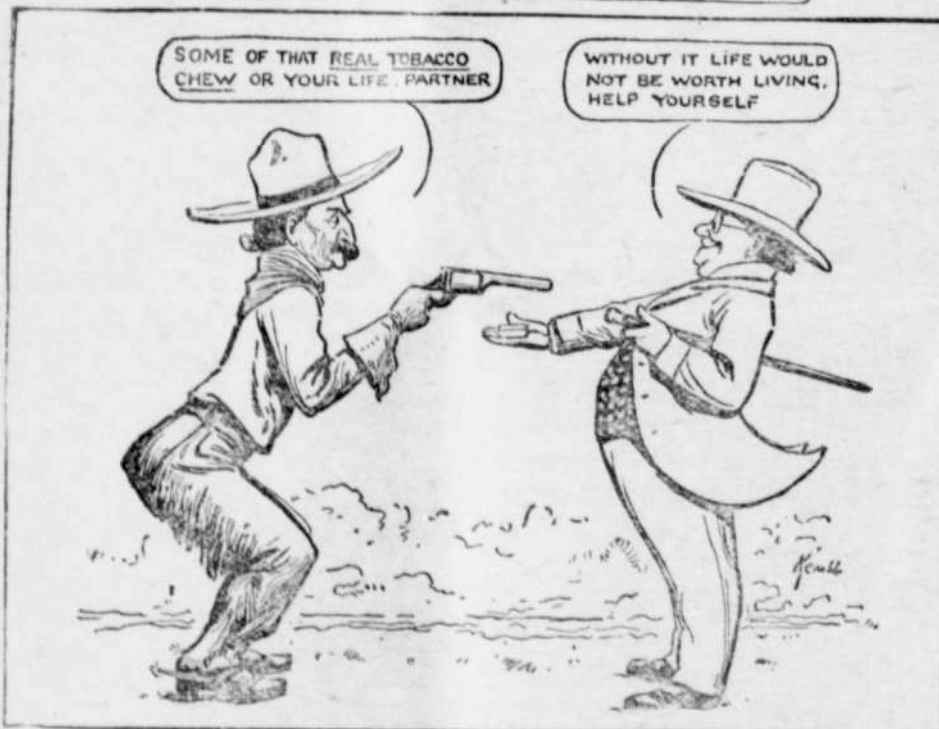
