If You Have a Good Thing Pass it Along.

Under this head we propose to inaugurate an exchange system of household helps and your favorite recipes. We believe you will be interested in this and ask your co-operation in making the Home Department of mutual helpfulness to the community.

Nut Bread.

Two cups white flour, two cups graham flour, four teaspoons baking powder, one teaspoon salt, one cup sugar. Sift all together and add one cup nut meats, one cup raisins, half cup molasses, one cup milk, one egg well beaten. Very nice—better than cake for lunches.

Chocolate Fudge.

Two ounces chocolate or cocoa, one-half cup milk, two cups granulated sugar, one-third cup syrup. Mix well over fire until chocolate is melted and allow to cook slowly. When mixture makes a soft ball between fingers when dropped in cold water it is done. Take from the fire and add one teaspoon vanilla and beat. As soon as it begins to grain it must be turned into pan as it hardens very quickly. Make in cubes when nearly cold.

Candy recipes will be appreciated now as it is so near the holidays.

Pea Soup.

One and one-half cup dried peas soaked over night and cooked until soft in one quart water. Put through sieve. Scald a couple slices of onion in one pint milk and add to the peas; remove onion and thicken with two tablespoons butter blended with a teaspoon flour. Season with one teaspoon salt, one-eighth teaspoon pepper, one teaspoon sugar. Canned peas may be used and it will require a whole can.

Things Worth Knowing.

Peach stains will yield readily to a treatment with spirits of camphor. Soak for a while in camphor, then wash in pure water.

A little butter in apple, cherry or peach pie improves the flavor.

When cushion covers becomes faded, if they are of strong material they can be used for bags for holding dusters or cleaning rags. Tack in any convenient place.

Make a silence cloth of cheesecloth with several layers of paper between, and you never will be troubled with fuzz on your polished table, caused by hot dishes.

In opening a dress pattern, write the number of pattern on each separate piece of tissue paper; it will save time and trouble in identifying stray pieces when replacing them in the proper envelope.

To quickly mend stockings when they are past darning, trim ragged part of hole in them, then crochet doubles around and fill up. You can also form heels and toes with crocheted doubles; lots easier than patching and will wear much longer. Use Saxon yarn for the woolen and darning cotton for the cotton stockings.

Save your empty spools to slip on nails to hang your clothing on. They will save many a tear and rust spot.
