Eggs of Crabs and Lobsters. Crabs and lobsters are hatched frot eggs, resembling upon birth nothing so much as the antmalculae shown by the mlcroscope in a drop of ditch water They are as unllke the shellfish they are to become in mature life as a grub is unilke a butterfly. In the case of the crab the egg clusters are attached beneath the animal after extrusion. while with the lobster they become fastened to the tail, which by fts fanning motlon increases the stream of oxygenated afr through and among the ova.
