INDIAN, AMERICA'S HERDSMAN.

The work of providing the Indian with a natural and profitable vocation, and at the same time assuring this country of an adequate meat supply, begun some two years ago, is progressing rapidly.

This involves turning the remaining Indian reservations into great cattle ranges, stocked and operated by the Indian himself. In the last two years, \$3,000,000 have been spent to stock the ranges with high grade livestock.

Notwithstanding the development of the livestock industry on the Indian reservations, the number of acres farmed by the Indians was greatly increased during 1915.

IF GUILTY PUNISHMENT**SHOULD BE SEVERE.**

Tuesday Evening's Telegram gives a picture of four of the eight men indicted by the grand jury for conspiracy in an alleged munitions plot.

Many persons who are indicted by a grand jury are not always guilty. A large number are the innocent victims of circumstances over which they have no control. It is unjust to condemn or convict any person before he has had an opportunity to present his side of the case. A man is presumed to be innocent until he is found guilty. That is what the law says and it is a wise provision. Otherwise, guilt would attach itself in the public mind to many an innocent man.

A half dozen American citizens have been indicted by a federal court on the charge of conspiring to cause strikes in

American industries in the interest of foreign belligerents. They have all announced their innocence and have said that they are not in any way connected with the charges that the grand jury has placed against them. It is hoped that they will be able to make good their claims when the matter comes before a jury in the open court. One of these men is a congressman. Another is an ex-congressman. A third was a former attorney-general in Ohio. They allege that this case is a frame-up against them.

If it should come to pass that any or all of these men are guilty, they should be dealt with severely by the court. The extent of the law will be none too drastic. They would, if guilty, be the proper persons to use as an example for other citizens of this country who may be lured into doing disloyal acts by the hunger after the money of foreign governments.
