Attorney General Says Compound Offered by Eastern Concern is Taboo.

Recently a reader of the Courier handed us an advertizement of a whisky p owder, stating that several of these advertisements were in circulation here and wanted to know its legality. We a ivised him to send the advertisement to the district attorney for his advice. The advertisement profusely stated that the powder could be sold and used in any state in the union and that it came withing the scope of preparations per mitted by the federal laws.
The following is clipped from one of our daily newspaper exchanges and is self explanatory:

A powder from which an Ohio company says "the most delicious and mellow whisky can be made" comes within the purvew of the prohibition law and cannot be sold in this state, ac cording to the opinion of Attorney General Erown for the district attorney of Coos county
"Attorney General Erown held that 'Zanol' came within the provision of the prohibition law whjch says all mixtures, compounds or preparations, whether liquor or not, which are intended when mixed with water or otherwise, to produce by fermentation, or otherwise, an intoxicating liquor, shall also te deemed to be embraced within the term intoxicating liquor,' as defined in the law.'

LAW OF 1913 PREVENTS SOUR GRASS bECOMING STATE HIGHWAY

McMinaville News-Reporter Says Old Fairdale-Trask River Road is Present Highway.

Because the Yambill-Tillamook highway goes over a very high hill, over the old Fairdale and Trask River route, as outlind on the map adopted within a vear after the passage of the state highway act in 1913, Yamhill county officials appeared before the state highway commission at Salem Wednesday and ask that the commission approve the Grande Ronde-Sour Grass route as the most practical route.
John Alberts of the advisory board contended that the board was powerless to make any change in the routes of the highways as adopted and the only way it could be changed was by legislative action. The law said the highway map must be adopted within a vear atter the act's passage. Governor Withycombe thought Alberts was right and Kay disagreed. It was decided to submit the matter to the attorney general.

The Foot of the Raindeer.
